

Energy Sustainability for Ireland

Event Brief

Energy supply in Ireland is undergoing a period of transition. Factors driving this change include:

- climate change and the need to move to a low carbon economy
- supply risk arising from 90 per cent dependence on price volatile imported fossil fuels
- erosion of competitiveness with prices significantly above EU averages.
- market uncertainty during the liberalisation process
- €20bn needed investment in electricity generation and network infrastructure by 2020
- small scale of the Irish market

IBEC encourages a multi-faceted approach to meeting Ireland's energy needs and recognises the importance of market forces in delivering the most economic solution.

Delivering economic solutions will require pragmatic informed decision-making managing the complimentary use of energy efficiency; renewable sources; conventional fuels; and research and development lead innovation.

Given the need for complimentary energy sources IBEC believe that Ireland must evaluate what fuel mix will best deliver secure, competitive and environmentally sustainable energy supply.

In order to stimulate this debate IBEC will on 2 November convene a meeting of industry leaders discussing a suitable fuel mix for Ireland. It is the purpose of this event to rationally examine realistic options with a view to identifying appropriate fuel mix scenarios.
